

1.1. **The purpose of teaching the discipline:** The purpose of the course “History of Ukraine” (for of foreign students) is to knowledge of foreign students of educational qualification level “Master” with the main periods of Ukrainian history, which is considered as an integral part of world history.

1.2. The main Tasks of Studying the Discipline:

2. Academic Subject Syllabus

PART 1.

History of Ukraine from ancient times to the end of the 18th century.

Topic 1. Introduction to history. The subject of the course “History of Ukraine”.

Definition of the concept of “history”. Place of History in system of social sciences. Historical chronology. Subject and periodization of the course “History of Ukraine”. Historical regions of Ukraine.

Topic 2. General information about Ukraine.

Geographical location of Ukraine. The population of Ukraine and the features of its placement. Administrative-territorial structure. Historical regions of Ukraine. Political system, state structure and authorities of Ukraine. State symbols and public holiday.

Topic 3. Early people on the territory of Ukraine. The early Slavs.

First human on the territory of Ukraine. Agricultural Culture of Trypillian. Cimmerians. Scythians. Sarmatians. Greek colonization of the Northern Black Sea Coast. The nomadic nations of the Ukrainian steppe. Great relocation of peoples: Goths, Huns, the settlement of ancient Slavs. Tribes of the Eastern Slavs: socio-economic system, beliefs, life, customs. Ancient country of Eastern Slavs “Rus’ “.

Topic 4. The flowering and destruction of the medieval state of Kyivan Rus’.

The emergence of Kyivan Rus’. The first princes of Kyivan Rus. Prince Volodymyr the Great and the baptism of Rus. Board of Yaroslav the Wise and the adoption the “Russkaya Pravda”. The reign of Volodymyr Monomakh and the deepening of the feudal fragmentation of Russia. Halitsia-Volyn principality. Mongol invasion and its consequences.

Topic 5. Ukraine at the XIV-XVII century: Lithuania-Poland era.

Political map of Europe XIV-XVII centuries. Ukrainian lands in the Grand Duchy of Lithuania. Krevska Unia in 1385. Lublin Union in 1569 and its

consequences for Ukraine. Features of the national policy of the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth (Rich Pospolyta). The Brestska Unia (1596) and its decision.

Topic 6. The origin of the Cossacks. Zaporizhska Sich.

Causes of the Cossacks. The etymology of the words “Cossack”, “Sich”, “Wild Field”. The foundation and main features of the internal structure of the Zaporizhska Sich. Military art, culture and life of Ukrainian Cossacks. Registered Cossacks. Ukrainian hetmans (second half of the XVI century - the first half of the XVII century). The role and place of the Cossacks in Ukrainian history.

Topic 7. The National Liberation War of the Ukrainian people against the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth in the XVII century. The Ruin.

Causes, driving forces and the nature of the war. Bogdan Khmelnytsky's Life Way. The first stage of the war: the Battle of the Zhovti Vody, near Korsun, under the Piliavtsi, under Zboriv. Signing of the Zboriv Peace 1649. Second stage: the Battle of Berestechko and the Bila Tserkva Peace Treaty of 1651. Pereyaslav Council of 1654. Formation of the Ukrainian Cossack State. The period of the Ruins on the territory of Ukraine.

Topic 8. Ukrainian Cossack state (Hetmanate).

The division of the country into the Left-bank and Right-bank. Hetmanate in the territory of the Left-bank of Ukraine. Slobidska Ukraine. Internal and foreign policy of Hetman Ivan Mazepa. The Constitution of Pylyp Orlyk. Liquidation of the Hetmanate and Zaporizhska Sich by the Russia at the end of the XVIII century. Inclusion of Ukrainian lands in the Habsburg Empire and the Romanov Empire.

PART 2.

History of Ukraine from the end of the 18th to the beginning of the 21st centuries.

Topic 9. Ukrainian lands in the XIX and at the beginning in the XX centuries.

Geopolitical situation in Europe at the end of the XVIII - early XIX century. Incorporation of Ukraine into Russia and Austria-Hungary. Cultural, national and economic policies of the Austro-Hungarian and Russian Empires on Ukrainian lands. Socio-economic and socio-political development of Ukrainian lands in the XIX and early XX centuries. Ukrainian emigration.

Topic 10. The National Democratic Revolution 1917-1921.

First World War and its consequences for Ukraine. February Revolution of 1917 in the Russian Empire. Activities of the Central Rada. October Revolution of 1917 in Russia. Formation and policy of the UNR. The emergence of ZUNR. The internal and external policies of the Ukrainian state (Hetman P. Skoropadsky) and the Directory. Civil War in Ukraine. Establishment of Soviet power on most Ukrainian lands.

Topic 11. Ukrainian lands 20-30 year the XX century.

Formation of the USSR. Social experiment on the creation of a communist society in the USSR. Industrialization and collectivization in Ukraine. The Holodomor of 1932-1933. Situation of Western Ukraine lands in the 1920s and 1930s.

Topic 12. Ukraine in the Second World War (1939-1945).

Foreign policy of the USSR on the eve of the Second World War. Deployment of the Second World War. The accession of Western Ukraine to the Ukrainian SSR. Occupation regime in Ukraine. Guerrilla movement and underground. OUN-UPA activity. Releasing Ukraine. The end of the Second World War and its consequences for Ukraine.

Topic 13. Ukraine in the second half of the XX century.

Development of the Ukrainian SSR in the 1950s-1980s. The crisis of the communist system in the USSR. Chernobyl Accident. Restructuring and destruction of the USSR.

Topic 14. The development of an independent Ukrainian state (1991 - to this day).

“Act of Declaration of Independence of Ukraine” of August 24, 1991. Adoption of the Constitution of Ukraine, June 28, 1996. Foreign policy course of Ukraine. The main trends in the development of industry, agriculture, infrastructure. The most significant achievements of Ukrainians during independence.
