General provisions regarding the organization of students' independent work

Independent work of students is the main means of mastering educational material in the time free from mandatory academic disciplines and is regulated by the "Regulations on the Organization of the Educational Process at Kharkiv National University named after V.N. Karazin". The university should provide students with professional training at the level of the best universities in the world, the formation of the necessary professional and general competencies, in particular: the ability to study independently and think critically.

Independent work of students of the 1-st year of the School of Law (specialty 293 "International Law") includes study of educational material and implementation of specific tasks; preparation for practical classes; working with materials developed for independent study by students; work with dictionaries, preparation for final control.

Study time allocated for independent work is regulated by the curriculum and is 60 hours. The content of independent work is determined by the work program of the academic discipline.

According to the curriculum, the total volume of the academic discipline for students is 5 credits (150 hours). The amount of independent work is 60 hours.

Requirements for students

During independent work, students should study grammatical material, learn to work with dictionaries, in particular electronic, textbooks and manuals compiled by domestic and foreign authors, use information and communication technologies, develop creativity and independent thinking.

Forms of control and evaluation criteria

Current control is carried out at each lesson. With its help, the level of formation of skills and abilities in all types of speech activity is checked. The test is conducted at the end of the 2- nd semester.

Final control - on a two-level scale (test) is conducted at the end of the 2-nd semester.

The relevant evaluation criteria are given in the Work Program of the academic discipline.
