

INTRODUCTION

The program of the discipline "Foreign Language (for Professional Purposes)" is drawn up in accordance with the educational and professional training program for the second (master's) level of higher education; field of knowledge 22 "Health care"; specialty 222 "Medicine"; educational qualification "Master of Medicine"; professional qualification "Doctor".

1. Description of the discipline

1.1. The purpose of teaching the discipline

Foreign language teaching has a practical goal of forming communicative competence in foreign students of the English-language form of education at the medical faculty at a level sufficient to ensure the possibility of free communication in typical situations of educational and professional communication sphere, which involves the development of skills and abilities in the main types of speech activity – reading, writing, speaking and listening, in the use of language tools to implement certain tactics of speech behavior to achieve the communicative goal. The basis for the formation of communicative competence is mastering Ukrainian language systems: phonology, lexis and grammar at a level sufficient for professional communication during clinical practice.

Program competences. For international students, Ukrainian-language communicative competence is the basis for the formation of general and professional competencies provided by the educational and professional program.

General competences: 1) GC 1. Ability to think abstractly, analyse and synthesise; 2) GC 2. Ability to learn and master modern knowledge; 3) GC 3. Ability to apply knowledge in practical situations; 4) GC 4. Knowledge and understanding of the subject area and understanding of professional activity; 5) GC 5. Ability to adapt and act in a new situation; 6) GC 6. Ability to make informed decisions; 7) GC 7. Ability to work in a team; 8) GC 8. Ability to interpersonal interaction; 9) GC 9. Ability to communicate in a foreign language; 10) GC 10. Ability to use information and communication technologies; 11) GC 11. Ability to search, process and analyse information from various sources; 12) GC 12. Determination and perseverance in relation to the tasks and responsibilities undertaken; 13) GC 13. Awareness of equal opportunities and gender issues.

Professional competences: 1) PC 1. Ability to collect medical information about the patient and analyse clinical data; 2) PC 16. Ability to maintain medical records, including electronic forms; 3) PC 25. Maintain professional and academic integrity, be responsible for the accuracy of the scientific results obtained.

1.2. The main tasks of studying the discipline

- Development and improvement of skills in perceptive and productive types of speech activity in situations of educational and professional communication at a level that provides the possibility of detailed communication in standard professional situations of clinical practice and in conditions of communication with elements of unpredictability.
- Foreign students acquire language and professionally oriented knowledge to implement doctor's communication strategies in the field of educational and professional communication with medical colleagues, patients, and relatives of patients.

1.3. The number of credits is 3.

The organization of education in Ukrainian higher education institutions is based on the credit transfer and accumulation system, and therefore the curriculum of the School of Medicine allocates 3 credits in the 9th semester for the discipline "Foreign Language (for Professional Purposes)".

1.6. Planned learning outcomes

As a result of studying the discipline of "Foreign Language (for Professional Purposes)", higher education students must achieve the following program learning outcomes:

1) PLO 1. Have a thorough knowledge of the structure of professional activity. Be able to carry out professional activities that require updating and integrating knowledge.

To be responsible for professional development, the ability to further professional learning with a high level of autonomy.

- 2) PLO 5. Collect complaints, anamnesis of life and disease, assess the patient's psychomotor and physical development, the state of organs and body systems, evaluate information on the diagnosis (according to list 4) based on the results of laboratory and instrumental studies, taking into account the patient's age.
- 3) PLO 21. Find the necessary information in professional literature and databases of other sources, analyse, evaluate and apply this information.
- 4) PLO 25. Clearly and unambiguously communicate own knowledge, conclusions and arguments on health care problems and related issues to specialists and non-specialists.
- 5) PLO 27. Communicate fluently in the state language and English, both orally and in writing, to discuss professional activities, research and projects.

The basis for achieving the above-mentioned outcomes will be the following developed communication skills:

Reading: to read, understand and reproduce texts about educational, professional, social and cultural spheres.

Listening: perceive texts by hearing speech of participants in a communication situation on relevant topics in the educational and professional sphere.

Speaking: to produce (unprepared) utterances; to participate in dialogue and polylogue.

Writing: to express thoughts in writing according to the language norms of the language.

2. Thematic plan of the discipline

Section 1

Repeating the terminology and active vocabulary of the topic. Improvement and development of conversation skills and production of monologue statements in professional communication situations related to diseases of the respiratory, cardiovascular, digestive, excretory, and bone systems.

Systematization and expansion of active and terminological vocabulary. Improvement of speech skills in communicative situations of taking anamnesis and

biographical information. Improvement of language skills in describing the clinical picture (ways to express circumstantial relations in a complex sentence).

Topic 3. Communicative means of professional speech in the therapeutic department.

Systematization and expansion of active vocabulary, a set of active grammatical and syntactic models. Improvement of communication strategies of dialogue and questioning about diseases of the respiratory system.

Topic 4. Communicative means of professional speech in the cardiology department.

Systematization and expansion of active vocabulary, a set of active grammatical and syntactic models. Improvement of communication strategies of dialogue and questioning about diseases of the cardiovascular system.

Topic 5. Basics of professional speech of a doctor in the gastroenterology department.

Systematization and expansion of active vocabulary, a set of active grammatical and syntactic models. Improvement of communication strategies for communication between a doctor and a patient with a digestive system disease.

Topic 6. Communicative means of professional speech in the urology department. Systematization and expansion of active vocabulary, a set of active grammatical and syntactic models. Improvement of communication strategies of dialogue and questioning on diseases of the excretory system.

Topic 7. Communicative means of professional speech in the surgical department. Systematization and expansion of active vocabulary, a set of active grammatical and syntactic models. Improvement of communication strategies for communication between a doctor and a patient with a musculoskeletal disorder.

7. Teaching methods

The following methods of teaching foreign students are aimed at achieving educational goals:

- *conscious-practical* (the leading method of teaching foreign languages, because, on the one hand, during practical classes, students realize the language forms necessary for communication; on the other hand, language material is mastered through foreign language and speech activities);

- *explanatory and illustrative* (used to teach and learn new educational material, facts, approaches, assessments, conclusions, etc.);
- *productive* (for students to apply what they have learned on the basis of a model or rule, an algorithm that follows instructions, rules, in situations similar to the model presented);
- the method of problem-based teaching (using various sources and means, in teaching foreign students, the teacher poses a problem, formulates cognitive tasks, and then, revealing the system of proofs, comparing views, different approaches, shows ways to solve the task; in this way, students become accomplices in scientific research);
- partially searching or heuristic method (in the organization of active search for solutions to cognitive tasks put forward by the teacher (or independently formulated under the guidance of the teacher, based on heuristic programs and instructions). The process of thinking becomes productive, but it is gradually guided and controlled by the teacher/students themselves in working with textbooks and computer programs. For example, method, one of the varieties of which is a heuristic conversation, is an effective way to activate thinking and encourage cognition);
- research method (after analysing the material, setting problems and tasks, and brief oral or written instruction from the teacher, students independently study literature, sources, conduct observations, and perform other search activities. Initiative, independence, and creative search are most fully manifested in research activities. Methods of educational work are directly transferred to methods that imitate and then implement scientific research).

8. Control methods

Routine control is carried out at each lesson. It is used to check the level of skills and abilities in all types of speech activities.

The final control (in written and oral form) is carried out at the end of the 9th semester – an exam.

Requirements for assessment materials:

Lexical and grammatical tasks.

An oral monologue on a given topic.

Oral modelling of a dialogue according to a given communication situation. The time for the task is 80 minutes.

Evaluation criteria:

The total score is 80 points.

Lexical and grammatical tasks are worth a maximum of 20 points.

An oral dialogue monologue (a simple text of at least 100 words within the program list of communication topics) is worth a maximum of 30 points, of which:
