#### **INTRODUCTION**

The program of the discipline "Foreign Language (for Professional Purposes)" is drawn up in accordance with the educational and professional training program for the second (master's) level of higher education; field of knowledge 22 "Health care"; speciality 222 "Medicine"; educational qualification "Master of Medicine"; professional qualification "Doctor".

# 1. Description of the discipline

### 1.1. The purpose of teaching the discipline

Foreign language teaching for professional purposes has a practical goal of forming communicative competence in foreign students of the English-language form of education at the medical faculty at a level sufficient to solve the necessary communicative tasks in the educational and professional sphere of communication, which involves the development of aspect skills and language skills in reading, writing, speaking and listening, as well as further development of skills in the use of language means to implement tactics of speech behaviour for successful communication. The basis for the formation of communicative competence is the mastery of the language systems: phonology, lexis and grammar.

**Program competences.** For international students, Ukrainian-language communicative competence is the basis for the formation of general and professional competences provided by the educational and professional program.

*General competences:* 1) GC 1. Ability to think abstractly, analyse and synthesis; 2) GC 2. Ability to learn and master modern knowledge; 3) GC 3. Ability to apply knowledge in practical situations; 4) GC 4. Knowledge and understanding of the subject area and understanding of professional activity; 5) GC 5. Ability to adapt and act in a new situation; 6) GC 6. Ability to make informed decisions; 7) GC 7. Ability to work in a team; 8) GC 8. Ability to interpersonal interaction; 9) GC 9. ### 1.2. The main tasks of studying the discipline

- Foreign students master skills in receptive and productive types of speech activity in the field of educational and professional communication.

- Foreign students acquire language and professionally oriented knowledge in order to achieve communicative goal and meet their own communicative needs in the field of educational and professional communication.

### **1.3.** The number of credits is 6.

### **1.6. Planned learning outcomes**

As a result of studying the discipline of "Foreign Language (for Professional Purposes)", higher education students must achieve the following program learning outcomes:

1) PLO 1. Have a thorough knowledge of the structure of professional activity. Be able to carry out professional activities that require updating and integrating knowledge. To be responsible for professional development, the ability to further professional learning with a high level of autonomy. 2) PLO 5. Collect complaints, anamnesis of life and disease, assess the patient's psychomotor and physical development, the state of organs and body systems, evaluate information on the diagnosis (according to list 4) based on the results of laboratory and instrumental studies, taking into account the patient's age.

3) PLO 21. Find the necessary information in professional literature and databases of other sources, analyse, evaluate and apply this information.

The basis for the above-mentioned outcomes will be the following developed communication skills:

**Reading:** to read, understand and reproduce texts in the academic, professional and socio-cultural spheres;

**Listening:** listen to texts and speech of participants in a communicative situation on topical issues of the educational and professional sphere and the socio-cultural sphere;

**Speaking:** to produce an (unprepared) utterance; to engage in dialogue and polylogue.

**Writing:** to express thoughts in writing in accordance with the linguistic norms of modern Ukrainian literary language.

### 2. Thematic plan of the discipline

#### Section 1.

Topic 1. Introduction of the doctor to the patient. Means of addressing in formal and informal situations.

Anthroponyms. The nominative and the vocative cases of nouns. Dialoguequestioning about the patient's passport information. Introduction of professional vocabulary.

Topic 2. Healthy nutrition of the patient.

The accusative case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives. Identifying a grammatical object: the accusative case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives in the singular. Indicating the direction of movement (action): the question куди?

Topic 3. Medical documentation: a general concept.

The accusative case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives. Introduction of professional vocabulary. Samples of medical records.

Topic 4. The student's field of study (at the university, faculty).

The local case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives. Indication of the subject's location: use of prepositions e(y), ha, npu and the local case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives in the singular. Indication of time: e(y), o + the local case. Indication of an instrument, an implement: ha + the local case.

#### Section 2.

Topic 5. Card of a patient. Patient's daily routine.

Verb. Types of verbs: perfect and imperfect. Designation of the process of action; repeated action; single action; result of action. Formation of professional vocabulary skills. Development of written communication skills.

Topic 6. Characteristics of pain in patient complaints.

The genitive case of nouns, pronouns, adjectives. Indication of presence/absence: constructions Y mene (the genitive case)  $\epsilon \dots / Y$  mene  $hema(\epsilon) + the genitive case$ . Indication of belonging to a subject. The location to or from which the object moves. Dialogue questioning about the patient's complaints.

#### 7. Teaching methods

The following methods of teaching foreign students are aimed at achieving educational goals:

- *conscious-practical* (the leading method of teaching foreign languages, because, on the one hand, during practical classes, students become aware of the language forms necessary for communication; on the other hand, language material is mastered through foreign language and speech activities);

- *explanatory and illustrative* (used to teach and learn new educational material, facts, approaches, assessments, conclusions, etc.);

- *productive* (for students to apply the algorithm learnt on the basis of a model or rule, which corresponds to the instructions, rules, in situations similar to the model presented);

- *the method of problem-based teaching* (using various sources and means, in teaching foreign students, the teacher poses a problem, formulates cognitive tasks, and then, revealing the system of proofs, comparing views, different approaches, shows ways to solve the task; in this way, students become accomplices in scientific research);

- *partially searching or heuristic method* (in the organization of active search for solutions to cognitive tasks put forward by the teacher (or independently formulated under the guidance of the teacher, based on heuristic programs and instructions). The thinking process becomes productive, but it is gradually guided and controlled by the teacher/students themselves in working with textbooks and computer programs. This method, one of the varieties of which is a heuristic conversation, is an effective way to activate thinking and encourage cognition);

- *research method* (after analysing the material, setting problems and tasks and brief oral or written instructions from the teacher, students independently study literature, sources, conduct observations and perform other search activities. Initiative, independence, and creative search are most fully manifested in research activities. Methods of educational work are directly transferred to methods that imitate and then implement scientific research).

### 8. Control methods

*Routine control is* carried out at each lesson. It is used to check the level of skills and abilities in all types of speech activities.

*Final control*: a differentiated test (in written and oral form) is held at the end of the 3rd and 4th semester.

### **Requirements for test materials:**

Lexical and grammatical tasks.

Written and oral modelling of a professional dialogue on a given topic.

The execution time is 80 minutes.

### **Evaluation criteria:**

The total score is 80 points.

Lexical and grammatical tasks are worth a maximum of 40 points.

Oral dialogue (a simple dialogue of 10-12 sentences within the program list of speech situations in the educational and professional sphere) is assessed with a maximum of 40 points, of which:
